Course Scope:

MTF course scope of instruction focuses on Army doctrine (ADRP 1-02, 3-0, 3-90, and 5-0) and the foundations for tactical planning and execution. The course learning outcomes span eight subject areas: Unified Land Operations, Operational Graphics, Offensive Operations, Defensive Operations, Combat Orders, Troop Leading Procedures, and Indirect Fire Planning. Course Outcomes: 1. Describe current combined arms maneuver doctrine to small-unit tactical operations. 2. Define the eight steps of Troop Leading Procedures. 3. Define mission, enemy, terrain and weather, troops and support available, time available, civil considerations (METT-TC) as it applies to small-unit tactics. 4. Brief a small-unit mission execution on a terrain model using the correct operational terms and graphics. 5. Describe the role of doctrine in the application of the art and science of tactics.

Special Information:

Waiver Authority: The Chief of Infantry is the waiver approval authority for this course. Students requesting course/phase prerequisite waivers (e.g. AOC/MOS, Rank/Grade, Medical/Physical Standards, etc.) or units requesting changes to POI content (e.g. during "on site" course conducts (MTT) request to delete/modify lessons/blocks of instruction, shortage of equipment, etc.) will submit their request through the first LTC Commander in their chain of command. Text Prerequisites

1. Selected personnel in the ARNG and USAR Component that meet all the prerequisites listed below and in DA PAM 351-4 (Army Schools Catalog).
2. Graduate of Army Basic Instructors Course (ABIC) or Common Faculty Development Program Instructor Course (CFDPIC).
3. Commissioned Officers must be in the Rank/grade of: O-1 to O-3(11A, 12A, 13A, 15A, 19A, 31A)

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4. Warrant Officers in the Rank/grade of: CW1 - CW3(131A)
5. Non-Commissioned Officers must be in the Rank/grade of: E-5 to E-8(11B, 11C, 11Z, 12B, 12Z, 13B, 13F, 13Z, 15Z, 19D, 19K, 19Z, 31B, 31Z)
6. Applicants must pass the Army Physical Fitness Test (APFT) per TC 3-22.20 and AR 350-1. (Administered by parent unit, DA 705 properly completed, showing successful completion within 12 months prior to graduation for reserve component students and within six months prior to graduation for Active Duty and AGR personnel).
7. Meet the Height and Weight standard of AR 600-9.
8. All students must possess a current periodic medical examination. Students over 40 must bring documentation of Over 40 Screening (if required).
9. Students will provide TRADOC FORM 350-18-2-R-E TASS Unit Pre-Execution Checklist upon in-processing.
10. Students will provide copy of DD FORM 1610 Travel Order and/or orders upon in-processing.
11. A waiver is required for all other DoD military personnel, civilians, contractors, and Foreign Military Soldiers assigned to a position instructing tactics.

You will need the following items for the course:

- a. Orders
- b. Valid Military ID
- c. ID Tags
- d. Pen, Pencil, Highlighter, etc.
- e. Notebook
- f. Laptop Computer/with charging cord
- g. Personal Hygiene items
- h. DA 705 showing Current passing APFT and passing height/weight
- i. DA 5500 (or 5501) showing compliance with AR 600-9 if over authorized weight.
